## Act No. 2 of 2004

[L.S.]

AN ACT relating to Family Proceedings

ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as  ${\ensuremath{\tt Enactment}}$  follows:—

[Assented to 30th January, 2004]

**1.** This Act may be cited as the Family Proceedings short title Act, 2004.

**2.** This Act applies to family proceedings whether in a Application of Act superior or inferior court of record.

**3.** In this Act, "family proceedings" means any cause or matter or legal proceedings—

*(a)* in connection with or arising out of matrimonial or other domestic relationships, including property interests; or

*(b)* concerning the welfare, maintenance, guardianship, paternity, custody of or access to children,

and in particular, proceedings under the statutes listed in the Schedule, but does not include any criminal proceedings.

Services of persons other than probation officers may be utilized may none

**4.** (1) Where in any family proceedings the court requires the services of a probation officer, the court may nonetheless utilize the services of any person whose qualifications are at least equivalent to those of a probation officer and who either—

(a) is a public officer; or

(b) is employed on contract by Government.

(2) A person, not being a public officer, whose services are utilized by the court under subsection (1) shall exercise the same functions and enjoy the same protection as a probation officer.

**5.** (1) Where in the opinion of the court the interest of the parties to any family proceedings may be better served if the matter or any aspect thereof is referred to mediation or to the unit responsible for social services in the court or to some other professional, the court may with the agreement of the parties, make the appropriate referral.

(2) Parties to any family proceedings may, with the approval of the court, agree to retain the services of a private mediator, counsellor or other professional.

(3) Any expenses incurred under subsection (2) shall be borne by the parties or either of them as the parties may agree.

Court may refer matter to mediation, etc. (4) The court may adjourn family proceedings in order to accommodate a referral under subsection (1) or the parties' desire to retain services under subsection (2).

**6.** The unit mentioned in section 5(1) may refer Referral may take parties to any of the services provided for in that place before commencement of proceedings.

**7.** (1) Mediation in any family proceedings is Mediation confidential and shall be subject to the provisions of <sup>confidential</sup> Part III of the Mediation Act, 2003.

**8.** (1) A report shall be made to the Court as to Agreement to be reported to the mediation resulted in agreement.

(2) Where there is agreement, the terms thereof may be communicated to the court if the parties so agree.

**9.** The Attorney General may by Order subject to Amendment of negative resolution, amend the Schedule.
