In sum, the defence and promotion of child rights is a key responsibility for the OAS, as there is no sure way of fulfilling its basic tasks without investing in this representative sector of the region.

In this way, the Congress will focus on three core issues:

- Violence against children. "Twenty-five years after the adoption of the Convention on the Rights of the Child: building peaceful environments".
- Juveniles in conflict with the law and criminal liability systems.
- \* The sexual exploitation of children.







In prior to the 21st Congress, a forum will be held with non-governmental organizations and IIN and OAS authorities, bearing in mind that the experience and contributions of civil society can enhance the development and promotion of child-related issues.

This meeting will have the following objectives:

To generate discussion and recommendations for the consideration of country delegations and authorities in preparation for the 21st Pan American Child Congress.

Increase and maintain the presence, participation and involvement of civil society organizations in the promotion of children's issues on the Inter-American agenda.
